Wondering Heights Walk from Black Edge Lane Visual Guide

This walk goes up a hill and most of the walk is unpaved. There is only one place to sit at the very end of the walk.

If you're using mobility tools, need rest points, or uneven and unstable surfaces are challenging, please take a look at the photos and decide if this is for you.

There's also constant wind. It's not strong, but it's always there.



The trail is very uneven with lots of large stones.



The trail may get very muddy at points.

This is what a muddier section looks like.


How Do I Get There?



The walk starts at Black Edge Lane in Bradford.

Postal code is BD13.

What3words: dozens.genius.punk



You can drive.

There is some limited parking on Halifax Road.

The road is busy so be careful when getting out of the car.



You can take Bus 67 or 502.

From the Bradford Interchange the bus takes about 30 minutes.

The stop closest to the walk is Craggs Lane.

Where is the walk?



The walk starts at Black Edge Lane.

The walk starts by going directly up the hill.

The path is gravel and uneven.







You'll reach a gate.

To open the gate you lift the latch.

The hill gets steeper after the gate.





About 0.1 km up the hill there is a round tree on the right.

Beside the tree is a marker for the Millenium Way Circular Walk

On the left is a break in the stone wall, a gate, and a path.

Turn left onto this path.

In the distance will be a wind farm.



There's no latch on the gate. Just push it open.



This path is gently rolling.

The footing is very uneven and unstable at points.



Follow the path about 0.4 km to a broken gate.

After this point the walk becomes steep again.

This might be a good place to turn around if you don't want to climb another hill.



If you want to keep going, turn right up the hill.



Just beyond the two stone markers take the left.



Follow the path to a gate.

On the left will be a ruined farm building.

Keep walking until you see this sign.

It is very faded, but says 'Public Bridle Path'.

From here, the path gets very uneven.

There will also be cyclists.

This is another point where you could check in and decide if you want to continue.



Keep walking in the direction of the sign.



This part of the walk is very open. There aren't a lot of landmarks.

The footing is very uneven.

Follow the deep ruts in the ground.



Follow the ruts until you come to a broken stone wall.

Got between the gap in the stone wall.

You'll be at the edge of the ravine.




Turn right and walk along the top of the ravine until you come to a stone bench.

To the right of the bench are these rocks.

There will be a very steep path leading down towards these rocks.



If you follow this path down you'll find this stone.

This stone is carved with a tribute Kate Bush wrote to Emily Bronte.



Climb back up to the top of the ravine.

Walk back the way you came.



Here's the path just after you turn through the broken stone wall.



Here's the path down just after the gate by the ruined farm.



Here's the broken gate.

You'll turn left onto the path beyond the broken gate.



Here's the gate at the end of the path.

You'll turn right out of this gate.
